I am disappointed that I was not able to have an input during the consultation process along with Ministers, Children's Commissioner's, DoE and others before they decided to sign up to the WHO framework for sexuality education (2010), in March 2017, as referenced in the Sexuality education in Central Asia (2017). Furthermore, there has been reference to a global sex education throughout many governments correspondence, documentation and school resources, UNESCO Technical Guidance. Perhaps if I and other parents had had this opportunity, then perhaps we would not be in this current situation.

Whilst I support your school and respect its staff, I am afraid that as a responsible parent I would feel guilty if I did not abide by my principles. I do hope you will understand how strongly I feel about this issue and that there is no hint of animosity connected to my actions. Yours.....
